Dear Praying Friends,

Things have really changed since our last letter. We are now in Mexico. We made it in about 9:30 on Tuesday evening, June 9th. Once across the border things went great, and we made it here to Pabellon De Arteaga in about nine hours. At the border we found that the tags on our trailer had expired. In fact they had been expired since October, 2008. (That was a big surprise!) We have done the biggest part of our deputation with expired tags! Thank the Lord for Dad, who got the tags for us and shipped them to Laredo so we could get across the border.

Things have been a slight adventure here. However, not all missionaries have the luxuries that we have been afforded. Praise the Lord for knowing a little bit of Spanish, being slightly acquainted with the town already, for a church here with people who are eager to help in any way that they can, and also that the people in town have been extremely patient with us as we have tried to buy food, water, gas, and many other things.

The kids seem to be adjusting well, they are already making friends in the church, several of the young people speak a little bit of English, and are eager to teach them and learn some English in return! They are also starting to learn their memory verses in Spanish, for Sundays, and for King's Kids on Wednesday nights.

We have not yet mastered the art of being late for things. The one church function that we decided to *not* be there early, but instead a little late, they actually started right on time. (Gringos, what do they know) We'll get it right before too long. We *have* only been here a couple of weeks.

Other than participating in the three regular services, the church here usually has visitation three times during the week, plus, a youth meeting on Saturday evening. This Saturday we went on a church outing to climb a mountain. The youth (including Kayla and Levi) and I, Pastor Oscar, and Pastor Josué climbed the mountain, while the ladies and younger ones drove around to the top. We are also thankful for five new churches taking us on for support this month. We were at 80% when we left Georgia, now we are showing 87%. Praise the Lord!

A special thank you to those prayer partners that have been praying for Robin's Grandpa. He is doing much better since his surgery, but he still has a ways to go before he is able to live at home again.

Please continue to pray for us as we continually try to get adjusted to living in a new country and new town. Pray also that we may be able to minister and be a blessing, even though we are not able to speak the language YET. We should start Spanish classes in August, and are looking forward to learning, and using what we learn!
